






## Installing a USB Device

When installing a USB device for the first time it may require drivers to be loaded. All necessary files should be preloaded on the Cycon computer. The directions below detail how to locate and install the necessary files.

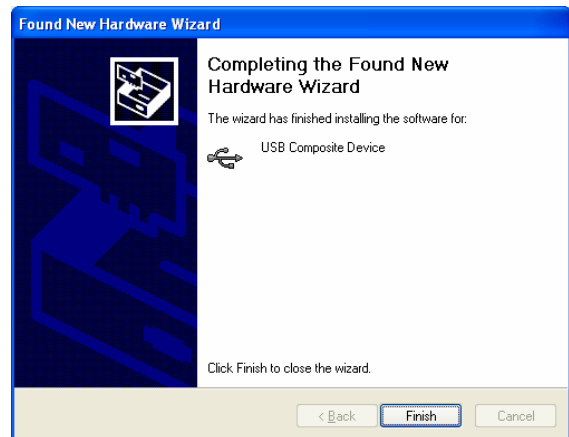
<p>Plug in USB device to any USB port. A balloon will appear in the system tray, showing new hardware is found.</p>	
<p>A Found New Hardware Wizard will appear.</p> <p>Select Yes, now and every time I connect a device. Then select Next.</p>	
<p>At the next screen, ensure "Install the software automatically" is selected and choose Next.</p>
